Keynote speaker

Brian Wesbury is Chief Economist at Griffin, Kubik, Stephens & Thompson, Inc., a Chicago-based investment bank. The *Chicago Tribune* has called him "Chicago's most prominent New Era Economist." In 1998, the *Wall Street Journal* ranked him as the third most accurate U.S. economic forecaster.

Wesbury is regularly featured on CNBC and CNN-fn and comments weekly on economic issues for WPTT radio in Pittsburgh. In Chicago, he may be seen on Channel 11's "Chicago Tonight" or heard on WBBM radio.

His regular monthly column "The Outlook" appears in *The American Spectator* magazine. In addition, he is a contributor to the editorial page at the *Wall Street Journal*, and his comments and writing have appeared in *Barron's*, *Investor's Business Daily*, *Forbes*, and the U.S. News and World Report.

Wesbury's first book, *The New Era of Wealth: How Investors Can Profit from the 5 Economic Trends Shaping the Future*, was published by McGraw-Hill in October 1999.

In 1995 and 1996, Wesbury served as Chief Economist for the Joint Economic Committee of Congress (JEC), chaired by Senator Connie Mack of Florida. While at the JEC, Wesbury advised members of Congress on economic issues relating to federal budget, tax, trade, and monetary policy.

The glacier that formed the mighty river also formed rapids that were difficult for early travelers to navigate. Early settlements, including the Quad Cities, emerged at the head and foot of those rapids because they were natural places to dock steamboats and drop off goods.

One way to enjoy the river is on the beautiful trails that run along it.

The new Great River Trail in Illinois runs 60 miles between Rock Island and Savanna, mostly directly along the River. The trail offers breathtaking views of the river, and excellent camping and historical sites. Both RiverWay and the Great River Trail have paved surfaces.

On the Iowa side of the Mississippi, RiverWay features more than 30 miles of trails for riding, roller blading and walking.

You can get up close and personal with the mighty river aboard the Channel Cat Water Taxi. Experience the power and mystique of the river as it sweeps around the great riverbend and flows east to west for one of only a few times over its length. The service is available weekends through October, with docks at John Deere Commons and Ben Butterworth Parkway in Moline and several locations in Iowa.

Oh, Deere!

With his invention of the "self-scouring" sod-busting steel plow, Vermont transplant John Deere changed the face of the prairie—Moline.

By the time Deere moved his company to Moline to take advantage of the river for transportation, he was producing 400 of the plows per year. Besides using the River for transportation, he used it for his factory, too: the River generated power for his production.

One man's dream blossomed into one of America's largest companies and one of the world's most identifiable brand names.

Historical tours related to Deere and other Quad Cities attractions depart from the John Deere Commons, located on the banks of the Mississippi. The Commons is at the site of Deere's original factory.

While you're at the commons, check out the interactive agricultural adventure inside a glass-encased architectural wonder. It's the largest agricultural exhibit in the world.

In downtown Moline, the John Deere Collector's Center gives visitors the opportunity to experience the lifestyle and heritage represented by a 1950's John Deere dealership. Guests see vintage Deere equipment and memorabilia, as well as interactive exhibits.

The corporate headquarters of Deere and Company has a farm implement museum with free admission.
