IDOR Update

Grocery Tax Suspension and Sales Tax Holiday

The Illinois Department of Revenue and the Local Tax Allocation Division have repeatedly stated that local government allocations would not be impacted by either the grocery tax suspension or sales tax holiday, but that statement is reliant on retailers correctly reporting the sales on their monthly Form ST-1, Sales and Use Tax and E911 Surcharge Return. The Department is aware that the day-to-day operations of local governments rely on these allocations and has paid extra attention to filed ST-1 returns that should have reported receipts for the grocery tax suspension. It was discovered that not all retailers are filing correctly. The compliance alert sent to all retailers registered with a Sales and Use Tax Account can be found [here](#).

The first disbursement that reflects the grocery tax suspension will be received in October. Ideally, the retailers that incorrectly filed their original Form ST-1 will have amended their July returns before this disbursement and filed their subsequent returns correctly. However, if these returns are not amended in time, allocations could be impacted. Please contact LTAD with any questions at REV.LocalTax@illinois.gov.

State Releases Illinois Family Relief Plan Resource Page

The Illinois Department of Revenue (IDOR) has released a resource page ([available via this link](#)) with details on the Illinois Family Relief Plan. In April, Governor JB Pritzker enacted Public Act 102-0700, which includes tax relief for Illinois families. The tax relief provisions include a six-month suspension of the inflationary increase of the motor fuel tax, a one-year elimination of the state sales tax on groceries, a sales tax holiday on school supplies and direct payments to Illinois families and property tax payers.

IDOR's resource page includes details on the amount of the direct payments, eligibility, when the payments are expected to be sent and frequently asked questions. UPDATE from the GASB

The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) has extended the deadline for completing its survey on capital assets to **September 16, 2022**. The survey is part of a GASB research effort to evaluate financial reporting of capital assets. Updated Estimates for State Shared Municipal Revenues

In the September 2022 issue of *Review* magazine, the Illinois Municipal League (IML) published updated estimates for state shared municipal revenues for Calendar Year (CY) 2022 and Municipal Fiscal Year (MFY) 2023. In addition, IML published preliminary forecasts for CY 2023. The estimates include the following revenue sources: the Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF), State Use Tax, Motor Fuel Tax (MFT), Transportation Renewal Fund (TRF), Cannabis and the Personal Property Replacement Tax (PPRT).

The revenue estimates take into account current and projected economic conditions, employment/unemployment and inflation and the impact each of these have on revenue collections for the state shared revenue sources.

Updated CDC Guidance – Governor Extends Disaster Declaration Through September 17

On August 11, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) announced it was streamlining its COVID-19 guidance to help individuals better understand their risk, how to protect themselves and others, what actions to take if exposed to COVID-19 and what actions to take if they are sick or test positive for COVID-19. The updated CDC guidance is [available via this link](#).

On August 19, Governor Pritzker signed a new Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamation ([available via this link](#)) extending the statewide disaster declaration through Saturday, September 17, 2022. Additionally, the Governor signed Executive Order (EO) 2022-18 ([available via this link](#)) extending previous executive orders.

With the signing of a new disaster proclamation, public meetings may continue to be held remotely, in accordance with Public Act 101-0640, as long as certain requirements are met. IML's fact sheet on the requirements for holding remote meetings during a disaster is [available via this link](#).

ILLINOIS GRANT PROGRAMS

Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) Applications

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) is accepting applications for ITEP. As part of the Rebuild Illinois Capital Plan, \$125 million in funding is available. Projects eligible for funding include biking and walking paths, trails, streetscape beautification work and other improvements

designed to encourage safe travel across various modes of transportation at the local level. A press release from the Governor's Office is [available via this link](#).

IDOT is hosting a webinar series to discuss ITEP. The first webinar focused on ITEP basics, eligibility criteria and best practices. A second webinar covered the application process and scoring and a question and answer session with IDOT staff. IML previously shared information about these webinars in the August 8 Statehouse Briefing ([available via this link](#)).

The final webinar will be held on September 14 at 9:30 a.m. This webinar will feature a question and answer opportunity with IDOT staff. Registration is [available via this link](#).

Open Space Land Acquisition and Development (OSLAD) Grant Application Now Open

Applications are now being accepted for the next round of OSLAD grants. The State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2023 budget includes \$56 million for the OSLAD program through the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR).

OSLAD grants are provided to local units of government for the acquisition and/or development of land for public parks and open spaces. Grant awards up to \$1,125,000 are available for land acquisition projects and awards up to \$600,000 are available for development or renovation projects.

Distressed communities that apply for an OSLAD grant may qualify for up to 100% financial assistance for their project; funding assistance up to 50% is available for all other qualifying communities that apply. A complete list of SFY 2023 distressed communities is [available via this link](#).

Applications must be submitted to IDNR through the AmpliFund Grant Management System ([available via this link](#)) by September 30 at 5:00 p.m. The IDNR press release on the SFY 2023 OSLAD program is [available via this link](#).

State of Illinois Submits Application for BEAD Planning Funds

The State of Illinois has submitted its application for \$5 million in planning funds available through the Broadband Equity, Access and Deployment (BEAD) Program. This \$42.5 billion federal program was established in the 2021 Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act. Illinois' proposed project, Connect Illinois for Universal Broadband Access and Digital Equity (Connect

Illinois) will utilize federal funding and cross-sector collaborations to continue the early successes of the Connect Illinois Broadband Grant Program.

Through the BEAD-funded planning process, Illinois will craft a plan to ensure access to broadband statewide. The project is focused on advancing the objectives of the BEAD program, including achieving universal access to basic broadband, establishing a plan for and making progress toward universal access and identifying and eliminating various digital equity gaps. Governor Pritzker Announces Anti-Violence Grants

On August 30, Governor Pritzker announced \$100 million in grants will be made available to fund gun violence prevention programs in municipalities across Illinois. This funding opportunity is in addition to \$123 million that was made available earlier this year through the Reimagine Public Safety Act (RPSA) and will support non-profit community-based organizations and local governments in 16 municipal areas (outside of the City of Chicago) to prevent and interrupt gun violence in their communities. Interested organizations are encouraged to use Illinois Department of Human Service (IDHS) resources, including navigator and technical assistance programs, webinars and a Grant Accountability and Transparency Act (GATA) app to assist with the application process. Office of the State Fire Marshal (OSFM) Grant and Loan Application Programs Now Open

OSFM has announced that the application period for the Small Equipment Grant Program (SEGP) is now open. SEGP was established to provide grants up to \$26,000 for the purchase of small firefighting and ambulance equipment. This year's application period, which ends November 30, will award \$1.5 million to eligible fire departments and ambulance services. OSFM is also accepting applications for the Illinois Fire Truck and Ambulance Revolving Loan Programs. This year, \$10.5 million is available for the Fire Truck Revolving Loan Program and \$2.7 million is available for the Ambulance Revolving Loan Program. Applications for the Fire Truck Revolving Loan Program ([available via this link](#)) and the Ambulance Revolving Loan Program ([available via this link](#)) must be electronically submitted or postmarked no later than October 31, 2022.

IEPA Files Proposed Rules on the Charging Infrastructure Grant Program

On August 9, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) filed rules for the Charging Infrastructure Grant Program ([available via this link](#)), which was part of the [2021 Climate and Equitable Jobs Act \(CEJA\)](#). On August 19, the proposed rules were [published for First Notice in the Illinois Register](#). There are 45 days for public comment on the proposed rules. Individuals wishing to submit a comment on the proposed rules may do so by contacting the following IEPA staff: Gina Roccaforte, Division of Legal Counsel, by email at Gina.Roccaforte@illinois.gov or phone at (217) 782-5544.

As part of CEJA, IEPA is required to provide funding to public and private organizations and companies to install and maintain Level 2 or Level 3 charging stations. Up to 80% of the cost of the installation of charging stations may be funded. Additional awards may incentivize installing charging infrastructure in eligible communities.

Constitutional Amendment on Workers' Rights

An initiative proposing to amend the Illinois Constitution will be considered by voters during the upcoming November election. If approved by voters, the right for workers to bargain collectively would be enshrined within the Constitution. The following language would be included in the Illinois Constitution's Bill of Rights:

SECTION 25. WORKERS' RIGHTS

(A) EMPLOYEES SHALL HAVE THE FUNDAMENTAL RIGHT TO ORGANIZE AND TO BARGAIN COLLECTIVELY THROUGH REPRESENTATIVES OF THEIR OWN CHOOSING FOR THE PURPOSE OF NEGOTIATING WAGES, HOURS, AND WORKING CONDITIONS, AND TO PROTECT THEIR ECONOMIC WELFARE AND SAFETY AT WORK. NO LAW SHALL BE PASSED THAT INTERFERES WITH, NEGATES, OR DIMINISHES THE RIGHT OF EMPLOYEES TO ORGANIZE AND BARGAIN COLLECTIVELY OVER THEIR WAGES, HOURS, AND OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT AND WORK PLACE SAFETY, INCLUDING ANY LAW OR ORDINANCE THAT PROHIBITS THE EXECUTION OR APPLICATION OF AGREEMENTS BETWEEN EMPLOYERS AND LABOR ORGANIZATIONS THAT REPRESENT EMPLOYEES REQUIRING MEMBERSHIP IN AN ORGANIZATION AS A CONDITION OF EMPLOYMENT.

(B) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION ARE CONTROLLING OVER THOSE OF SECTION 6 OF ARTICLE VII.

A proposed Constitutional amendment becomes effective if approved by either three-fifths of those voting on the question or a majority of those voting in the election.

The initiative will be placed on the November ballot as a result of the General Assembly approving [SJRCA 11](#) in 2021 by votes of 49-7 in the Senate and 80-30 in the House.



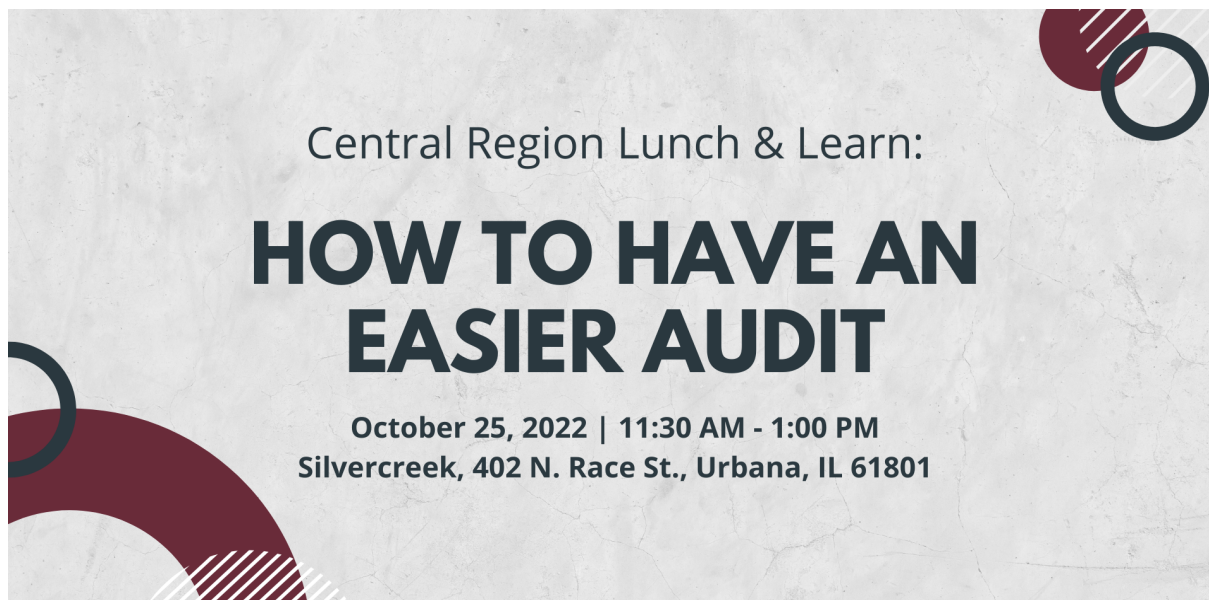

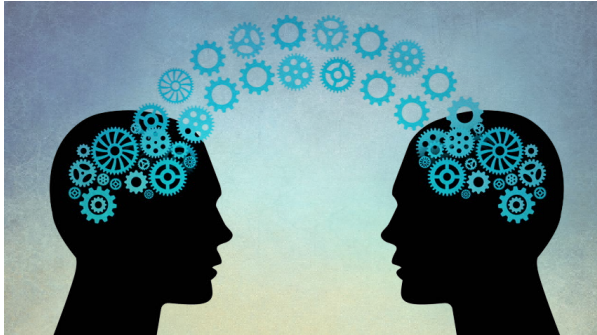
